Abstract

This workshop is set to investigate the relations between culture and politics in Arab societies in a state of serious political crisis - war, occupation, revolution - by going back to the contribution of Bourdieu's sociology to the study of cultural fields. One of the major contributions of field theory was to go beyond an opposition of internal and external readings of texts (and, beyond that, all cultural production) by showing how these cultural goods (or works) and the social actors which produce them are also the product of the history and structure of a specific, social space more or less autonomous with regards to the field of power, largely independent from constraints imposed from outside. But how is that in the context of war or revolution? How does internal conflict (Lebanese and Algerian Civil Wars), occupation (Palestine, Iraq) or revolution (Egypt, Tunisia, Syria from 2011-2012) affect the players in the cultural field and their products? How do the forces of the field play out in these exceptional circumstances?
